### Party Fetes 98th Birthday Of Mrs. Elma Booher, Boone Native

Mrs. Elma O. (Schooler) Booher, who observed her 98th birthday on Monday, April 24, and was honored with a small party in her room in the new wing at Witham Hospital during the afternoon, is a lifelong resident of Boone County. With the exception of the past year she always has lived in or near Whitestown.

She is a member of a pioneer Boone County family and was born near Whitestown, a daughter of Charles and Naomi Schooler and was married to Vando Booher, who died several years ago. Mr. Booher was a teacher in early Boone County schools and later was connected with the Farmers State Bank of Lebanon and was employed in the county treasurer's office. For ten years after his death, Mrs. Booher made her home in Whitestown with a niece, Mrs. Thomas How-

ard, until entering the Witham Hospital on May 3, 1960. Last October 26 Mrs. Howard also came to Lebanon for residence at 1018 North Lebanon Street.

Mrs. Booher has been a member of the St. Mark's Lutheran Church at Whitestown for many years.

The party feting Mrs. Booher was arranged by the niece, Mrs. Howard, and Mrs. Agnes Seale, her special nurse, and was held in Room 259 that was furnished by her nephew, Ben Tomlinson, in the new wing at the hospital.

The birthday cake, an angel food, was baked and decorated by Mrs. Ralph Emmons. Mrs. Booher received many gifts, including several plants and greeting cards. Among her callers were Mrs. Emmons, Mrs. Holman Carr, Dr. and Mrs. Ralph Harvey, the nurses on the floor, Isadore

Eichman, a patient at the hospital and also a native of Whitestown, and the niece, Mrs. Harmon, and a nephew, Ben Tomlinson.

Although her health and sight have failed in recent months, she is mentally alert and her hearing is good, enabling her to enjoy and converse with her visitors and graciously accept their congratulations and best wishes on her anniversary.

## Elma Booher Oct 24 1961 Claimed At 98

Mrs. Elma O. Booher, 98 years old, a patient at the Witham Memorial Hospital for more than a year and one-half, died at 10:45 a.m. today of complications incidental to her age.

She had resided in Lebanon and Whitestown most all her life where she raised two children in her home; Mrs. Thomas B. Howard, of Lebanon, and Mrs. Other Wood, of Shelbyville, Indiana. She had made her home with Mrs. Howard and the late Mr. Howard for 10 years before entering the hospital. Mrs. Howard had been a constant companion of Mrs. Booher during her illness.

The deceased was born in Boone County, April 24, 1863, the daughter of Charles and Naomi (Gochenour) Schooler. She was married in Boone County to Vando Booher, who died in 1934.

The most immediate survivor is a brother, Emery Schooler, of Zionsville; as well as several nieces and a nephew. One brother is deceased.

She was a member of the Lutheran Church of Whitestown.

Funeral services will be held at 10:30 a.m. Thursday at the Russell & Hitch Funeral Home in Lebanon, with Pastor R. J. Lavin officiating. Burial will be in the Oak Hill Cemetery.

He retired from farming and sold his farm in 1941, when he moved to 4934 Broadway St., Indianapolis, Marion County, Indiana.

Eugene E. Schooler, age 77 years, a former Boone county farmer, passed away Tuesday night at ten o'clock at his home, 4934 Broadway, Indianapolis, following a several years illness. His death was caused by a complication of ailments.

Mr. Schooler was born in Boone county, a son of Charles and Naomi (Goehenour) Schooler. He was reared in the Whitestown neighborhood and farmed as long as his health permitted. In 1941 he sold his farm, three and one-half miles south of Whitestown, and moved to Indianapolis for residence. He was a member of the Whitestown Knights of Pythias Lodge, now disbanded. He was married September 5, 1885, at the age of eighteen years in Boone county to Effie Utterback, who survives.

Surviving are the widow, a brother, Emory R. Schooler, of near Whitestown; a sister, Mrs. Elma Booher, of Whitestown, and several nephews and nieces.

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon at two o'clock at the Bratton Brothers funeral home, where friends may call. Burial will be in Oak Hill cemetery.

### More About Emory Rodney Schooler:

Emory was a farmer and a member of Salem United Methodist Church, Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana.

1904: Owned land - SW 1/4 of SW 1/4 of Section 32, 40 acres, Eagle Township, Boone County, Indiana (1904 plat map). At this time he likely lived in the house in the curve of Boone County Road 700 E just north of Indiana State Road 334 in Boone County, Indiana.

1920: Emory is listed in *Prairie Farmer's Reliable Directory of Farmers & Breeders, Boone County, Indiana, 1920* as living on 154 acres in Range 1 Eagle Township, Section 31, owned by George L. Rader [his step-father], Whitestown telephone system, and as owning an Overland auto.

He later owned land - N 1/2 of NE 1/4 of Section 31, 80 acres, Eagle Township, Boone County, Indiana. On this land was the former Pitzer house where Emory, Anna, Charles Butler and Gladys lived. This house is on the north side of Boone County Road 525 S, just east of County Road 650 E, Eagle Township, Boone County, Indiana. After Anna died, this property was sold and Emory lived for a time with his grandson Charles Lowell Schooler. The house was later restored by Ken Hollis.

The brick Pitzer House was built by Sidney Legrand Pitzer for his wife, the former Miss Virginia Caroline Gilmore, on land homesteaded by Nash Legrand (born 1795) and Jane (Gilmore) Pitzer (Pitzer Book, Patrick Henry Sullivan Museum, Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana, pp. 131-134, 140). The land was purchased on November 20, 1861 (Pitzer Book, pp. 140-144).

February 18, 1868: Boone County, Indiana, Henry Lucas, Notary Public - "Sydney L. Pitzer and Virginia C. Pitzer his wife convey and warrant to Addison Pitzer, Luther C. Pitzer and Mary A. Pitzer for \$1000, the following real estate: Undivided 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Sec. 32 except 1/2 acre deed by Authority Branimare to the School District for School purposes [where the Eagle Township District School #3, the Pitzer School, was built], 240 AC [acres]. Received for record 11th April 1868; recorded in No. 13, p. 1137 (Pitzer Book, p. 147).

Nash Pitzer appears in the 1850 Census for Boone County, Indiana, age 55, net worth \$3000.

Regarding the Susan Schooler estate, Vando L. Booher was mentioned as guardian of Gail and Marie, minor heirs of Susan Schooler. (Zionsville Times, January 14, 1915, card file in Patrick Henry Sullivan Museum, Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana.)







Dora was a dressmaker and millinery store operator for 20 years. She was a member of St. Mark's Lutheran Church, Whitestown, Boone County, Indiana, and of the Order of the Eastern Star in Whitestown.

More About Dr. Perrin B Little:

"In 1918 the United States was hit hard by an outbreak of Spanish influenza. There were over 60 deaths in Boone County attributed to the flu. Fred Taylor, son of Dr. Oscar Taylor, told of his father's and Dr. Little's struggle to help the stricken. Fred was in college at the time of the outbreak. He took time off from school to come home so he could drive the buggy for his father while he made house calls on the sick. Both Dr. Taylor and Dr. Little worked long hours, until completely exhausted. Dr. Taylor finally was stricken himself with the flu, as was Dr. Little. With both of the town's doctors down, Dr. Coons from Lebanon came to Whitestown to help out. Dr. Taylor passed away October 16, 1918. Dr. Little pulled through but was done for some time. Dr. Little died some years later of a heart attack while working on his home." (Whitestown history, Janice West)


