## More About Charles Butler Schooler:

Charles was likely born in his parents' house in the curve of Boone County Road 700 E just north of Indiana State Road 334 in Boone County, Indiana.

Charles farmed with his dad at an early age. He plowed with a walking plow pulled by horses and threshed grain with a company. For several years he raised some cattle and hogs, and also milked a few cows. For several years market gardening kept him busy after the crops were laid by and the hay was in the barn. (Interview, Olive Harmon Schooler)

Before 1914: Attended Eagle Twp. School #5 (Swamp College), Boone County, Indiana, and the Good School, north of Whitestown, Boone County, Indiana. In 1914 he was attending the Union Township District #8 School, Boone County, Indiana.

1918: Graduated from Eagle Twp. School #5 (Swamp College), Boone County, Indiana

1922: Graduated from Zionsville High School, Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana.

Between 1923 – 1930: Worked at Fairbanks and Morris (?) and Polk Milk Company, Indianapolis, Marion County, Indiana.

About 1930: Attended Central Normal School, Danville, Hendricks County, Indiana.

About 1932: He was a teacher for one year at the Royalton School, Boone County, Indiana. He was the last teacher at that school. After teaching that year, he decided that teaching was for the women.

From 1933 to 1935: Charles and Olive lived in Royalton, Boone County, Indiana. At the time, it was the last house on the right going north on Indianapolis Road (US Highway 52).

From 1935 to 1984: Charles and Olive lived in the brick house south of the curve in Boone County Road 650 E just north of Indiana State Road 334, south of Whitestown, Boone County, Indiana.

Between 1934 – 1973: Charles was a farmer.

Charles was a member and trustee of Salem United Methodist Church, Zionsville, Boone County, Indiana. He was also chairman of the Eagle Township Farm Bureau for 4 years, as well as a member of the board of the Boone County Co-Op for 9 years.
